These rockets used model engines with electrical ignition systems. These model engines propel the rocket up into the air what looked like 50 feet.

The rockets used engines which were inserted into a pipe used as the body. A parachute system was integrated into the rockets but sadly didn't have a successful execution of it. Our students rockets were made from wooden fins glued to pipe bodies with the model engine and parachute system attached to them. On the day of the launch, there was a small turn out but it was worth the watch and supervisors Mr Coleman and Mr Woddward were happy there were no rocket injuries.
