### Part 1

Hosseini writes ‘The Kite Runner to show all that has gone wrong in his country. How does he do this?’

### Part 2

‘The Kite Runner shows that only through redemption can one’s guilt be truly overcome.’ Do you agree?’

## Context Practice Pieces

1. Compose an article to be featured in a magazine on parenting about the responsibility of adults to nurture the talents and imagination of children. You should refer directly to the themes of identity and belonging and indirectly to ideas covered in *Sometimes Gladness*.

2. In relation to *Witness* or *Sometimes Gladness* compose either a fictional narrative or expository piece on the following prompt:

‘The first group we belong to, the family, has more influence that any other group on forming our identity.’

3. In a sustained piece of writing (of either expository or persuasive form) refer to the following prompt:

‘Some people judge others by the way they look and dress, thinking this tells them who the person is.’

Your piece is to included in a sociological journal which examines the lives of different communities and must make indirect reference to *Witness*.
